## Activities of the DAC Study Group, History, for 2011-2012

The main activities of this study group continue to be the Historical Lecture in EUROANALYSIS and the production of the series of publications, "People and Places Important in the History of Specific Countries", and related items from additional researches, particularly on countries that are, will or have been the hosts of a EUROANALYSIS Conference. An up to date list of these and related publications are available on the DAC web-site

In the review period members of the group have remained in active e-mail contact, some will meet in Prague, the outputs, current and proposed projects are listed below:

- (a) Work continues on the major task of producing an account for Germany, host of two EUROANALYSIS conferences, "Some People and Places Important in the History of Analytical Chemistry in Germany" [Burns, Mueller, Salzer and Werner]. The first draft of the text for period from Albertus Magnus in the thirteenth century to the mid twentieth century is completed. In view of the size of the text the authors will discuss in Prague the format to work towards, including the possibility of that of an e-book.
  - (b) The account of the history of analytical chemistry in Serbia has been published.
