The signatories agree hereby to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding to cooperate and to work towards developing global standards for teaching chemistry at university level.



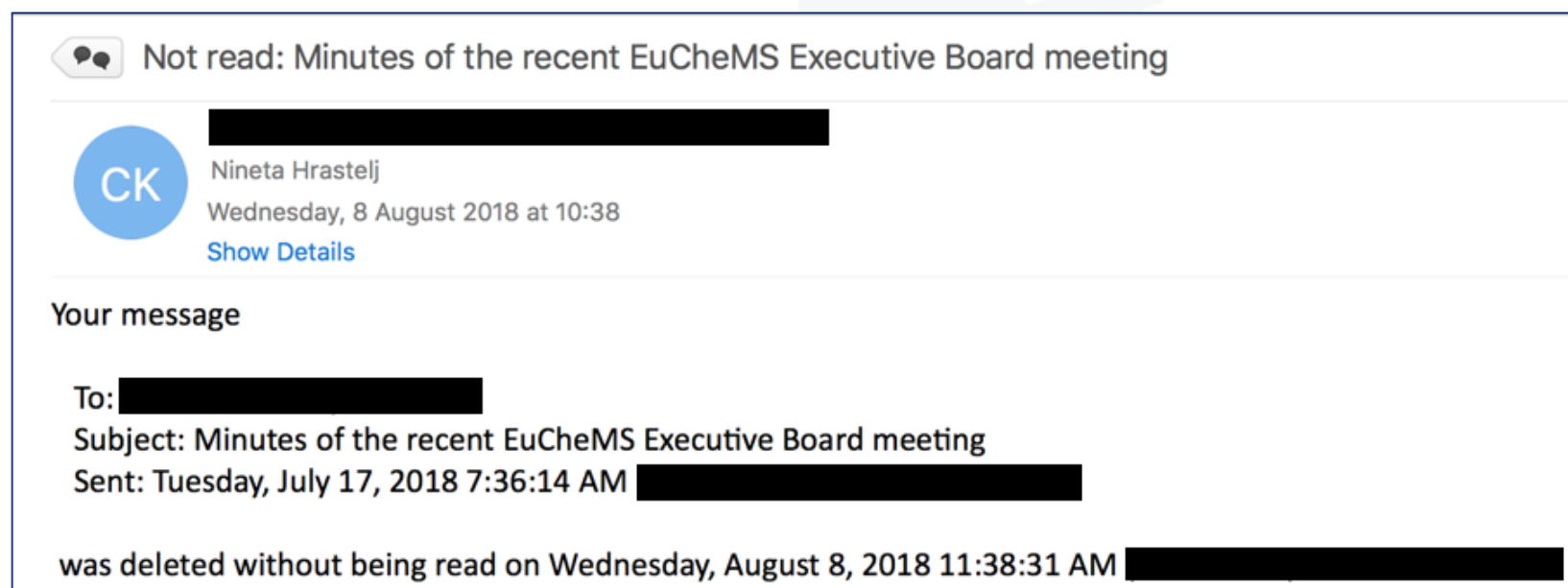
