

EuChemS Division of Organic Chemistry Young Investigator Award

Introduction

The Young Investigator Award is an annual award that acknowledges outstanding scientific achievements by an early-career researcher active in the field of organic chemistry.

The awardee is selected among the researchers who have been nominated to participate in the Young Investigator Workshop (YIW) that year, based on the submitted CV, abstract and publicly available information on official websites.

Selection

The Executive Committee (President, Secretary, Treasurer, Dissemination Officer) selects a 3-person Award Committee among the Societies' representatives in the EuChemS Division of Organic Chemistry Board. The Executive Committee should be informed of any conflicts of interest between the award committee and the nominees. The Executive Committee then divides the nominees into three groups, avoiding any conflicts of interests. Each Award Committee member selects the two top candidates from their own group, then the six top candidates will be discussed and ranked by the Award Committee. A short text that will be used as award motivation should also be written. The selection procedure will be completed by the end of April of the same year.

In case of any conflicts of interests between the top candidates and the Award Committee, one person from the Executive Committee will replace that person before the ranking of the top candidates.

Award presentation

The award is announced on the EuChemS Division of Organic Chemistry website and in the YIW Book of Abstracts. The awardee is invited to give a talk at the ESOC or EuChemS Chemistry Congress one year later. The other top-ranked candidates will be nominated to join the Young Investigator conferences in USA/Canada, according to our agreements with the American and Canadian Chemical Societies.
