### **MINUTES**

#### **1. Opening**

Chair Marcela Segundo (MS) welcomed all present Delegates and Guests, especially Jean-Manuel Segura, the new delegate of the Swiss Chemical Society, and thanked them for their participation in the meeting. She explained that this online meeting was convened due to the low attendance of DAC meetings held in person, particularly those taking place in conjunction with the EuChemS congress. MS informed that guidelines allowing online voting will be discussed at the Annual Assembly, as well as the holding online DAC annual meetings in years when the EuroAnalysis conference is not held.

#### **2. Chair's remarks**

MS informed Delegates and Guests that call for EuChemS-DAC awards, Robert Kelner Lecture and DAC Award, is open until November 30, 2024. Nominations by the societies can be sent to the DAC Secretary, Snezana Miljanic (SM), and to her.

MS reminded that Study Groups were recently transformed into Task Groups (TG), therefore she invited DAC members to propose activities within new Task Groups. The deadline for submitting proposals for the TGs is November 30, 2024. She emphasized that one of the TG activities could be the organization of a session at the EuroAnalysis 2025 (EA 2025) conference. Elia Psillakis expressed interest in proposing a Task Group that would include activities related to EA 2025

MS invited Anna de Juan (AdJ) to address the organization of the EA 2025 conference in Barcelona. Using ppt presentation, AdJ reported on the progress of the organization of the conference, describing the conference venue and website, and listing the members of the organizing and scientific committee and sponsors. She emphasized that

the Spanish Society of Chromatography and Related Techniques (SECyTA) will integrate its meeting within the EA 2025, hence expecting larger number of participants. AdJ asked DAC members to distribute information about the conference to members of their societies via emails and the society website.

MS informed that EuChemS Chemistry Congress (ECC 10) will take place in Antwerp, Belgium, in 2026, and that the organizers asked EuChemS divisions for participation in organizing sessions.

### **3. Any other business**

#### *3.1 Date and venue of the 2025 DAC Annual Meeting*

MS announced that the next DAC Annual Meeting will take place on Sunday, August 31, 2025, at 9.00, in Barcelona, Spain, prior to the EuroAnalysis 2025 conference.
