

What Should Stick? Research on a Sticky Note

– Rules and Regulations –

1. Application

- **Format & Submit:** Prepare and e-mail your contribution as a JPEG (min. 300 dpi) using the official EYCN PowerPoint template to science@eycn.eu.

Click **here** for the template.

- **E-mail body:** Include your full name, age, country, affiliation, education level, PhD completion date (if applicable), and e-mail.

2. Author Requirements

- **Eligibility:** 35 years old or younger, or within 7 years of completing your PhD.
- **Authorship:** First or corresponding author of a peer-reviewed article published within the last 12 months in a chemistry or related-field journal. *Note: Other authors who are neither first nor corresponding authors also may submit a Sticky Note, but they must provide a statement of significant contribution and CC the first author on the application.*
- **Responsibility:** You take full responsibility for the originality and content of your submission.

3. Content Requirements

- The text must be in English and accessible to the broader chemical community.
- Submissions violating scientific practice and ethics will be automatically rejected.

4. Formatting and Review Guidelines

- **Template Strictness:** Include your full name, affiliation, title, main text, and reference exactly as outlined. Do not alter the template's text size, font, justification, or spacing.
- **Word Limit:** The main text cannot exceed 100 words.
- **Referencing:** Omit author names. Use this exact format: *Journal title*, **year**, volume(issue), page numbers.
- **Figures:** You must secure necessary copyright permissions and cite the original source.
- **Review and Revisions:** Submissions are evaluated by the EYCN Science Team. No direct corrections will be made, but you may be given 14 days to complete requested revisions.
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
